Margaret Stookesberry recently completed a calligraphy-rich trip to Chicago, here is her observations...

It was a great trip - we spent 5 days in the Chicago Art Institute, going in before the public was admitted. I went to Chicago primarily for a Road Scholar class at the Chicago Art Institute. (Road Scholar is the new name for Elderhostel.) We had two or three one-hour lectures each



day by various curators in various galleries. The current "big" exhibit is called "Van Gogh's Bedrooms" and features 3 versions of a painting of his bedroom at Arles. Our group was allowed into the institute each day a half hour before it opens for the public. We were able to see most of the Van Gogh materials with only 15 people in the room before the crowds arrived. We also used individual listening devices so we could hear our lecturer easily even in crowded galleries. A walking tour of Chicago architecture was also included.

What I did see was the Chicago guild's annual juried show, which was wonderful. But I didn't take any photos as everything was behind glass and it was somewhat crowded as it was the opening reception. I got in on the end of a few demonstrations - one on paper cutting, one on folding cranes and one using a hot knife to cut foam core. I was so excited by that - I went right back and ordered the tool from Amazon.

My sister in law and I went two days early and were able to see the Chicago guild exhibit at the Newberry and go to the symphony and Field Museum on our own. We also had tickets for an exhibit of Fashions from Downton Abbey at another museum on our free afternoon. Road Scholar housed us in the Palmer House Hotel - a very beautiful building that was about two blocks from the institute and the symphony hall in the middle of the historic lakefront area along Michigan Avenue. You don't have to be over 55 to take Road Scholar classes anymore and this one was an amazing bargain considering what was included. I'd recommend it to anyone interested in art history.
